The monies will provide two local children suffering with cancer and their families a break on the South Coast. Respite is something that has always been close to the charity's heart – especially now with the cost of living situation, these breaks have taken on even more significance.

Joe Cavanagh, the Trust & Foundation Officer from Lennox Children's Cancer Fund said: "Respite can mean so much to families, from offering an escape from what life is throwing at them, being able to reconnect together, and – from the evidence that I have witnessed – it is also a physical and mental tonic that lifts both broken bodies and broken minds. Sadly, in some cases it is about creating everlasting memories when a child is having palliative treatment. Thanks to Fairlop Lions Club, two more families will benefit from this vital service."



'The unsung heroes': Seven Kings Lions Club (CIO) Creates food hubs

Seven Kings Lions Club is a relatively small club consisting of only seven members in the heart of East London. However, the seven members are a shining example of teamwork and practising Lionism. The unity within their club is inspiring, whereby they have achieved so much to help within their local community. During the pandemic, members of the club tirelessly distributed large quantities of beverages, ready meals etc. and took advantage throughout the pandemic to feed the needy. As well as supporting individuals, they also catered for local hospitals as well as local and regional charities by providing meals. Over time, they cooked and distributed five tonnes of rice and other food products contributing hugely towards the hunger project. In monetary value, these quantifies in excess of approximately over £75,000.

This has progressed immensely. The need for food continued which lead to the setting up of a food hub charity called 3Food4U by Kalpesh Kapasiawala and supported by Past President Lion Bob Jandoo, who is the trustee. In a short space of time, this has grown to five food hubs for local communities, essentially 'cashless supermarkets' that now run on

a weekly basis to feed those in need. This has sparked interest across the community where everyone is welcome and the food hub feeds many regular users.

Members of Seven Kings Lions Club have raised funds in excess of £20,000 and collected donations from various sources. A match funding bid was applied for as well as a £10,000 grant from the lottery funding, and a further £7,500 from local corporate businesses.

3Food4U have signed up with their Tesco supermarkets and other national food providers, where members of the club collect van loads of donations every week to stock in their food hubs. Club President Lion Kishor Tailor praised Lion Bob for his tremendous efforts as well as all the other club members dedicating their time to ensure the food hubs are a continued success. At a recent business meeting, DG Kavaljit Dev visited the club and shared her gratitude for their service and congratulated them on their achievements.







Just Walk
