How to attract new members

In this article, I will explore and suggest some ideas for attracting new members so that you can ask them to join your club.

As a starter, why not host a "bring a friend" meeting. Start thinking of all the people you know who may want to join your club, then invite them to this meeting. In fact, I would propose that you hold a special event, a special guest day, and ask every member of your club to invite at least one person they know to hear about your club. Whilst you're at it, why not invite members who have left the club. You could also put together a guest information pack that highlights the service activities undertaken that you can handover at the end of the meeting to those who attend. So, what format should this open evening be? You could make it a wine and cheese reception, and if you're a dining club you could organise a special dinner meeting. You could also organise this special meeting at a low commitment venue like a coffee shop.

The best advertisement for your club is your club members. They should be encouraged to wear their Lions pin at all times. That way, when someone asks you about the pin, you can take that opportunity to talk about your club. Also, you could give your club members business cards so they can hand them out to friends and acquaintances. Another good idea I came across recently was to produce a promotional video. Using a smart phone, anyone can produce a video. Just ask your members to speak to the camera and talk about the joy of belonging to a Lions club and how they're making a difference. Once you've got your video, you could upload that into a WhatsApp group and share that with the prospective members.

If you are struggling to attract new members, you could attempt to organise your meeting at a different time. Not everyone can make it to an evening meeting, so perhaps you could have a meeting at lunchtime via Zoom.

In these trying times, consider offering a three-month trial membership to those who are undecided to commit to Lions. That will give them the opportunity to take part in your activities without having to pay any dues - they can participate as a friend of the club.

There are so many ways of attracting members to your club. Just try the ones I've suggested and I'm sure you will come up with a host of other ideas. Just keep trying.
