



£10,000 Donation to London Air Ambulance

On 7 July, members of Sudbury Lions Club had the privilege of visiting the London Air Ambulance helipad, where they presented a cheque for £10,000. This donation, raised during last year's Bhajan & Bhojan fundraiser, will contribute to the purchase of a new helicopter.

For over three decades, the London Air Ambulance has been at the forefront of emergency medical care in the capital. Their highly trained teams of doctors, paramedics, and pilots respond rapidly to life-threatening situations, providing critical care directly at the scene.

The funds were raised at the Bhajan & Bhojan event, which has become the Lions Club's flagship annual fundraiser. The event blends spiritual music (Bhajan) and traditional Indian food (Bhojan), drawing a large crowd of community members who are eager to support charitable causes.

This year's Bhajan & Bhojan function is scheduled for 29 September, and the club is already hard at work preparing for another night of music, food, and philanthropy. The proceeds from this year's event will once again be dedicated to a very worthy cause, with details to be announced soon on the Club's <u>Facebook page</u>.

Vision Screening Programme

Over four years ago, the concept of a vision screening programme aimed at improving the lives of children aged 5-7 years was first discussed. This initiative, inspired by the successful Lions KidSight USA programme, has already made a significant impact in the United States, identifying vision problems in thousands of children and even saving lives. Now, District 105A the "A-team" - has the opportunity to join this sight-saving mission with the support of a dedicated team ensuring standardised training and quality control.

To implement this programme across our district, we need to raise funds to purchase screening cameras. Each camera costs approximately £5,600 and with 20 cameras required, our total target is £56,000, which we are aiming double by applying for matched funding from the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). Currently, we have £15,000 in District funds, thanks to the generosity of many Clubs.

Time is of the essence, as the bid for LCIF funding must be submitted by the end of September, with a decision expected in January. We are asking Clubs to consider making a donation of £500 towards this vital project. Alternatively, Clubs may wish to contribute £5,600 to purchase an entire camera. Clubs that donate the full amount may choose to retain ownership of the camera, while those purchased through matched funding will be owned by the District and used throughout our area.

Diabetes Health Screening: Walthamstow Town Centre

On Saturday 6 July 2024, the diabetes team from Whipps Cross University Hospital's Gillian Hanson Centre conducted a health screening event at Walthamstow Town Centre. This event was organised by Fairlop Lions Club and drew over 200 attendees.

During the walk-in clinic, participants received measurements of height, weight, blood pressure, and random blood glucose levels, along with general health advice. Many attendees, due to busy lifestyles or other factors, rarely have the chance to seek medical advice or undergo routine testing. Among those seen was a woman in her mid-thirties, who, despite having elevated random blood glucose and high blood pressure, had been unaware of her Type 2 diabetes diagnosis. Additionally, she reported blurred vision and had been experiencing weight loss for over a year. Four other individuals discovered they had high blood glucose levels and were previously unaware of their diabetes.

This case highlights a common issue: individuals with undiagnosed diabetes who are already experiencing complications. Diabetes and hypertension are notably more prevalent in Britain's Asian communities compared to the white population.

Addressing diabetes, hypertension, and their complications within these communities is crucial not only for health protection but also for reducing healthcare costs associated with treating these complications. Effective measures include education on diabetes and hypertension, modifying behavioural risk factors, early diagnosis, and rigorous control of blood glucose and blood pressure levels.

For many patients who do not have regular access to their GPs, these health screening events are invaluable. Even if just one life is saved, the effort invested in these events proves to be extremely worthwhile.
