Lions Child Sight UK: Vision Screening in Schools

Lions from District 105A recently visited St John's Church of England Primary School to carry out Lions Child Sight UK vision screening.



The Lions Child Sight UK vision screening is an important initiative designed to detect potential eyesight problems in children at an early stage.

Using a state-of-the-art handheld camera, trained Lions volunteers were able to quickly and non-invasively screen pupils' eyes for common conditions such as lazy eye, short- or long-sightedness, and other vision irregularities that may go unnoticed in everyday classroom activities. The process takes only a few seconds per child, with results that can help parents seek timely professional advice and treatment if required.

Early detection of sight issues is vital for a child's development, learning, and confidence. By identifying problems before they impact schoolwork or social activities, Lions are helping to ensure that every child has the best possible chance to thrive.

The session at St John's was met with enthusiasm and curiosity from pupils and staff alike, and it demonstrated once again how Lions Clubs continue to make a meaningful difference in local communities through practical, hands-on service projects.






23rd Annual Senior Citizens Celebration
